CRITTER(S) OF THE WEEK! BLUEFIN TREVALLY (BLUE ULUA) & HAWAIIAN

CLEANER WRASSE—These beautiful jacks are silvery blue with scattered blue spots and electric blue fins; they can quickly change their color to become almost black; most common jacks in Hawaii; grows to about 30 ". This one is being groomed by an adult Hawaiian Cleaner Wrasse. These small fish make their living by picking parasites and dead tissue from the bodies of larger fish; adults are yellow and magenta with a black stripe; at night they encase themselves in a heavy mucus for protection; these little guys are essential to the keep our reef fish healthy!
