Frogfishes are the ultimate sedentary predators. Barely recognizable as fish, they sit for long periods in one spot, blending perfectly with the reef. Their pectoral fins grasp the substrate like hands or feet and can be used to clamber about. Their first dorsal spine resembles a slender fishing rod; a fleshy lure at the tip mimics a small fish or worm which it wiggles to attract prey. They engulf their prey in less than 6 milliseconds...far to quick for the eye to follow! This enables them to capture a meal without the other fish
