HAWAIIAN DOMINO DAMSEL ("alo 'ilo 'I") - This endemic reef fish give off a 'chirping" sound underwater when disturbed. Also commonplace for divers is to have them snap at your fingers or hands if they have eggs nearby. Juveniles are jet black with a white spot on either side and a neon blue spot on the forehead. As they mature they lose the white spot and the blue dot on their forehead. They are almost always found living in and around branching coral heads.
